

Graduate Non-Degree Seeking Petition for Federal Financial Aid

Important Information and Definitions

Non-degree seeking students are generally not eligible to receive federal financial aid, however, students who are taking prerequisite classes for admission may use this form to appeal.

Please note: students who are only taking classes to raise their GPA will not qualify under this exception.

When completing the 20xx-20xx Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), Graduate Non-Degree seeking students should PROVIDE OR UPDATE* the following answers to the questions listed below:

Federal Loan Eligibility Limits

For purposes of federal financial aid eligibility, Graduate Non-Degree seeking students are considered enrolled in "preparatory coursework to enroll in a graduate program." Independent students may be eligible to borrow up to \$12,500 in Federal Direct Subsidized and/or Unsubsidized loans. The amount and loan type is based on demonstrated financial need and other information provided on the FAFSA. Dependent students may be eligible to borrow up to \$7,500 in Federal Direct Subsidized and/or Unsubsidized loans. Your dependency status is determined by federal regulations (<https://studentaid.ed.gov/fafsa/filling-out/dependency>). The Petition for Graduate Preparatory Work is limited to a single consecutive 12-month period.

The following criteria must be met to be eligible for The Petition for Graduate Preparatory Work:

- The courses to be taken are prerequisites for enrollment in a program leading to a degree.
- The courses must be part of an eligible program otherwise offered by the school even though the student is not yet enrolled in that program.
- The student is enrolled at least half-time (6 units) in these prerequisite courses.
- The preparatory courses may not be used to raise the student's GPA in order to be admitted to the program.
- The student must not have previously received loans under this provision.

If you need to borrow beyond the limited amount of Federal Direct Loans available to you, parents of dependent students may be eligible to borrow the Federal Direct Parent PLUS Loan. Independent students seeking to borrow beyond the limited amount of Federal Direct Loans may pursue a private educational loan.
